African liaison and Family and Reproductive Rights Education Program (FARREP)

Mercy Hospital for Women has a program to support:

- African women and families during their care at the hospital, or
- women who come from countries where female circumcision is sometimes practiced.

Our FARREP/African liaison worker can:

- explain the different types of care available to you before the baby is born
- stay with you during your consultation to discuss female circumcision
- introduce you to other services at the hospital which may be helpful such as social work, physiotherapy, dietician or diabetes education
- offer culturally appropriate guidance to doctors, midwives, nurses and others, so that your needs are better understood
- discuss your concerns with hospital staff if you need more support
- help you provide feedback about your care in the hospital
- give information about female circumcision in Australia and its effects on women's health
- establish and maintain links between the African communities and Mercy Hospital for Women.

This service is optional.
